PRIVACY POLICY

Westminster Chapel (“we”, “our” and “us”) are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy.

For the purpose of the Data Protection Act 1998 (the “Act”), the data controller is Westminster Chapel of Buckingham Gate, London, SW1E 6BS.

INFORMATION WE COLLECT FROM YOU

We will collect and process the following data about you:

- Information you give us. This is information about you that you give us by:
 - filling in a contact form on our website <http://www.westminsterchapel.org.uk/> (our “website”);
 - by corresponding with us by phone, e-mail or otherwise;
 - filling in a ‘Get Connected’ form, a ‘Giving Envelope’ or any other form that we may make available either generally or for particular events, services or ministries; or
 - filling in a form or passing us other materials as part of our [Foodbank](#) or [CAP](#)
The information you give us may include your name, address, e-mail address and phone number, financial and credit card information, personal description and photograph.
- If you use our [Foodbank](#) ministry we retain a copy of the form you provide us. If you use our [CAP](#) ministry we retain a copy of the materials you provide us. In the case of both of these ministries, we may combine some or all of the information you give us with any other information you give us or that we may collect from you. We may also access this information from the databases operated by [The Trussell Trust](#) (in the case of the [Foodbank](#) ministry) and by [Christians Against Poverty](#) (in the case of the [CAP](#) ministry).

- Information we collect about you. Each time you visit our website, we will automatically collect the following information:
 - technical information, including the Internet protocol (IP) address used to connect your computer to the Internet, browser type and version, time zone setting, operating system and platform; and
 - information about your visit, including the full Uniform Resource Locators (URL), clickstream to, through and from our website (including date and time), page response times, download errors, length of visits to certain pages, page interaction information (such as scrolling, clicks, and mouse-overs).
- Information we receive from MailChimp. If you choose to join our Mailing List on MailChimp (see below), then we will collect the contact information that you register with MailChimp. This information may include your name, e-mail address and postcode.
Sensitive Personal Information: The information that we collect and store includes sensitive personal information such as information about physical or mental health, religious beliefs other beliefs of a similar nature and racial or ethnic origin.
Keeping your information up to date: We do our best to keep the information we hold about you up to date. If you notice any errors, or you no longer wish to receive information from us, please contact us at: office@westminsterchapel.org.uk.

MAILCHIMP

If you are already a member of our church, we will have added you to our MailChimp list. MailChimp's Privacy Policy is [available here](#).

If you are not a member of our church, and are already on these lists, it is because you have explicitly given us your consent to be contacted. This was through filling in a Get Connected form on a Sunday, through our App, or our website (described above). We only store your name and email address on the MailChimp system, which you can unsubscribe from at any point. Unsubscribing deletes your information and terminates your contact with us.

CHAPEL APP

We collect no personal information about you through the Chapel App, except for the Get Connected forms mentioned above and occasional information that is entered through [Google Forms](#) and [Doodle](#). This information is not stored with Google or Doodle, nor the Chapel App, but transferred to our secure servers if needed, or destroyed once the event / survey has ended.

COOKIES

Our website uses cookies to distinguish you from other users of our website. This helps us to provide you with a good experience when you browse our website and also allows us to improve our website. For detailed information on the cookies we use and the purposes for which we use them see our [Cookie policy](#).

USES MADE OF THE INFORMATION

We use information held about you in the following ways:

- Information you give to us. We will use this information: to serve you and generally to establish and maintain your involvement with us including:
- keeping you informed about church services, activities and events;
- providing you with any information, products and services that you request from us;
- answering any queries you may have by email, post, telephone, mobile phone and fax;
- registering you for events you have asked to attend;
- assisting the leadership team and trustees with the management of issues relating to Westminster Chapel; and
- enabling members of the ministry team to communicate with you; and
- carrying out our obligations arising from any contracts entered into between you and us.
- Information we collect about you. We will use this information:
- to administer our website and for internal operations, including troubleshooting, data analysis, testing, research, statistical and survey purposes;
- to improve our website to ensure that content is presented in the most effective manner for you and for your computer;
- to allow you to participate in interactive features of our service, when you choose to do so; and
- as part of our efforts to keep our website safe and secure.

DISCLOSURE OF YOUR INFORMATION

We will not give away, sell, rent or disclose any personal data about you to any third parties other than in the following limited circumstances:

- If you use our [Foodbank](#) ministry we will disclose the information you provide to [The Trussell Trust](#).
- If you use [CAP](#) ministry we will disclose the information you provide to [Christians Against Poverty](#).
- We are under a duty to disclose or share your personal data in order to comply with any legal obligation.
- In order to enforce or apply our [Privacy Policy](#)
- To protect the rights, property, or safety of any member of Westminster Chapel or any other person.

WHERE WE STORE YOUR PERSONAL DATA

Once we have received your information, we will use strict procedures and security features to try to prevent unauthorised access.

The data that we control may be transferred and stored outside the European Economic Area (“EEA”), for example where our software providers store information on servers outside the EEA. It may also be processed by staff operating outside the EEA who work for us or for one of our suppliers. Where there is a transfer outside the EEA we will ensure that organisation to whom information is transferred is one which subscribes to equivalent standards under the Act.

We will take reasonable, necessary steps to ensure that your data is treated securely and in accordance with this privacy statement.

We will store your information for no longer than reasonably necessary, usually for the time that you are attending the church or are a member of the church. After this we may continue to hold your contact details for as long as you agree in order to keep you informed about the ministry of the church.

ACCESS TO YOUR INFORMATION

The Act gives you the right to access information held about you. You can request access to the personal information that we hold about you by contacting us at office@westminsterchapel.org.uk. The assigned data protection officer is Rebecca Tan. We will provide you with access to your personal information unless we are legally authorised to refuse your request. We may charge a reasonable amount for providing access.

If you wish to change personal information that is out of date or inaccurate at any time please contact us. After notice from you, we will take reasonable steps to correct any of your information which is inaccurate, incomplete or out of date. If you wish to have your personal information deleted please let us know and we will delete that information wherever practicable.

We may refuse your request to access, amend or delete your personal information in certain circumstances. If we do refuse your request, we will provide you with a reason for our decision and, in the case of amendment, we will note with your personal information that you have disputed its accuracy.

SECURITY

We will take reasonable steps to keep secure any personal information, which we hold and to keep this information accurate and up to date.

Unfortunately, the transmission of information via the internet is not completely secure. Accordingly, we cannot accept responsibility for the security of information you send to or receive from us over the internet or for any unauthorised access or use of that information.

We take security measures to protect your information from access by unauthorised persons and against unlawful processing, accidental loss, destruction and damage. Your information will be held for a reasonable period or as long as the law requires.
